

A MINI LETTERING WORKSHOP

An online workbook to help you create your own fun and fantasical letters!

What you will need:

- *A printer (or someone that will print it for you)
- *cardstock for the templates and scissors
- *paper
- *pencil/eraser and a ruler
- *markers, coloured pencils, crayons or paint
- ***YOUR IMAGINATION**

Basic Steps

Read through the BASIC STEPS before you start!

Step 1. You will need an adult to help you download, print out the workbook, and help you with cutting the templates.

Step 2. Watch the video!

Step 3. Gather your supplies and work through the practice pages on scrap paper.

TO FINISH:

Step 4. On your good piece of paper (a little heavier)

lightly sketch your letter(s).

Step 5. Add your features and then erase all the lines you DON'T want.

Step 6. Using the black permanent marker, go over all of your pencil lines.

Step 7. Now you can colour!

Supplies and Tips

*Washable markers work great beacuse they dont seep through the paper and they dont smudge the black outline.

*A nice black marker will really make your artwork pop! Not too thin...

*You might want to add wiggly eyes to your robot, or pom poms to the antennae!


*If you want to frame your artwork, consider painting an inexpensive frame to match your drawing. Just use ordinary craft paint.

*Using a heavier paper is easier to erase on and nicer with markers.


Extras: fine black marker, white gel pen, white chalk marker, glitter, metalic markers,

PARTS OF A LETTER

Every letter is made up of 5 basic parts!




The shapes shown above would make 'block' letters, like this:



* Sometimes, like with the H, there are alternatives. Can you think of more?








Let's make a ROBOT letter!

First, decide if you want your finished art to look like this:




Then draw about a 1/2 inch border around the edge (this helps remind you not to go too close to the edge in case you want to frame it)



Use a black marker for the border


Next, arrange the shapes of the letter you have chosen on the paper (like we practiced at the beginning) and with your pencil, lightly trace around the shapes

As you go, you can erase the pencil marks you don't need




Sometimes you can flips the shapes over to make them fit better

Now we are ready to add our ROBOT parts!



Now you can take your black marker (remember, not to thick and not too thin) and outline the whole thing!






Finally, you can add some patterns (dont forget about the background) and COLOUR!

Remember to try to pair up some colours to make a *fade* like I explained in the video!
